

## **Data Protection Notice - Province**

This notice is for all candidates and Freemasons of the Province of Hampshire and Isle of Wight. It applies to the processing of your personal data by the Province. Please note that your personal data will also be processed by your Lodge(s) as a separate data controller and you are referred to the 'Data Protection Notice – Lodges', attached to this Data Protection Notice

## A Use of your data during your application to become a Freemason

As a candidate to become a Freemason, you consent to the processing, retention and sharing of your personal data for the purpose of assessing your membership application and any other Masonic applications you may make. You can withdraw your consent and request erasure of your data at any time prior to your initiation by notifying your proposer and seconder that you wish to cancel your application. Your data will then be erased.

## B Use of your data after you become a Freemason

As a Freemason your data will be processed, retained and shared for any reasonable purposes required by the Book of Constitutions or the bodies it sanctions from time to time.

Please contact the Provincial Data Protection Officer (the Provincial Grand Secretary), by post or email if you wish to:

- 1. Object to the processing of all or part of your personal or masonic data;
- 2. Request access to your data.
- 3. Request correction of all or a part of your data.

The legal basis on which your personal data will be used is the legitimate interests of the Province as a not for profit membership organisation to act in accordance with the Book of Constitutions and with this Data Protection Notice.

In this notice "Book of Constitutions" means the General Laws and Regulations for the Government of the Craft of the United Grand Lodge of England from time to time.
